Economic recovery depends on jobs and good government. During this critical time in our nation's economy, the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce rates the performance of the Board of Supervisors in growing the economy, creating jobs and improving government efficiency. The Chamber's ratings are based on the votes of all Supervisors on ten key legislative actions impacting job creation and government efficiency in 2009. This voting record is intended to highlight those Supervisors whose actions are helping to create paychecks and those who are triggering pink slips in San Francisco.

## GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY

### **One-Time Revenues Charter Amendment (Elsbernd, Chu) (support)**

Charter Amendment to limit the expenditure of one-time revenues to one-time uses.

### **Must Spend Charter Amendment (Daly) (oppose)**

Charter Amendment to mandate the expenditure of identified appropriations for particular programs or activities designated by the Board of Supervisors.

## JOB CREATION

### **Hunters Point Shipyard Redevelopment (support)**

Motion approving Final Map for a 397 unit residential condominium project within the Hunters Point Shipyard Redevelopment Plan.

### **Recurrent Energy Agreement (Mayor, Chiu, Dufty, Alioto-Pier, Mar) (support)**

Ordinance approving a 25-Year Power Purchase Agreement and Site Lease Agreement with Recurrent energy to create the largest urban solar power plant in California.

### **Tax Measure Special Election (oppose)**

Resolution calling for a special election on June 2009, for the purpose of submitting new tax measures to the voters.

### **Sales Tax Increase (Avalos) (oppose)**

Ordinance creating a 0.25 percent increase in sales tax in San Francisco to pay for city health services.

### **Film Rebate Program (Alioto-Pier, Dufty) (support)**

Ordinance amending the Film Rebate Program, promoting San Francisco based film productions by setting a cap on the rebate and requiring good faith efforts to hire disadvantaged individuals as a condition of receipt of a rebate.

### **Naming Rights for Candlestick Park (Dufty, Elsbernd) (support)**

Motion to allow the Recreation and Park Department to sell naming rights of Candlestick so long as fifty percent of the revenue from the agreement funds recreation center directors.

### **Contemporary Art Museum (Alioto-Pier) (support)**

Resolution supporting locating the proposed Contemporary Art Museum in San Francisco.

### **Union Street Restaurant Uses (Alioto-Pier) (support)**

Ordinance providing for a limited number of new Small Self-Service Restaurants and Self-Service Specialty Food uses on Union Street.
